# Safety Zone: Nine Keys to a Successful Accident Prevention Program

Creating a safe workplace for employees to perform their duties is essential in reducing accidents, injuries and illnesses that hurt employees and create financial liabilities for employers. Employers who emphasize safety and empower workers to take responsibility for their own and their co-workers' well-being is a sound and desirable business practice. Not only is focusing on safety the right thing for employees and their families, but it is also a realworld approach that can increase quality, loyalty, operational efficiencies and the company's overall financial performance.

The following steps can be used as a starting place to create and maintain an organization that continually identifies and analyzes its risks measured against existing controls and makes the needed improvements for the company's betterment.

1. Top management support and active leadership in safety must exist, and a <u>written safety policy</u> must be communicated to all employees.



2. Supervisors should be held accountable for the incidence of job-related injuries just as they are held responsible for production and quality objectives. Their performance evaluations should consider their units' safety performance.

- 3. Supervisors should be trained, have a solid understanding of and be responsible for the following activities:
- Job hazard analysis
- Regular workplace inspections
- Accident investigation
- Employee relations and motivational techniques
- · Costs of accidents on production and company profits
- Safety rules and procedures
- Work closely with HR to return injured workers to productive activity within the medical restrictions assigned by the treating physician until they are released to full duty or otherwise released from medical care

Supervisors and reliable employees should be included in the rule and procedure-making process to ensure that correct data reflects actual working environments and conditions and ensures buy-in from all workers.

4. Effective training, particularly of new employees, is critical. In some industries, it is estimated that new employees (less than six months on the job) account for 30% of all injuries. Poor work habits or unsafe behavior should be corrected immediately. A formal system of disciplining employees for unsafe behavior is recommended; however, only after determining why an employee acted unsafely (<u>root cause analysis</u>).

- Highlight safety in all phases of the hiring process and integrate safe behavior into job training, starting on day one
- Make sure that leaders are continually emphasizing safety as a top priority and that it is integrated into all job functions
- Keep training relevant by aligning it with actual workplace hazards and conditions (see Job Hazard Analysis in 3)
- Train employees when new procedures are introduced
- Train employees when safety performance is not meeting objectives, and lack of understanding is identified
- Train employees on the hazards of chemicals and proper controls using Safety Data Sheets available from the supplier or manufacturer
- · Contact your workers' compensation insurance carrier to see what training resources are available to you as a policyholder



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5. Establish a safety committee that includes top management, front-line supervisors and production personnel. Safety committees must discuss accidents, solutions, hazards and their correction. They must be focused on priorities, and management should make every effort to implement the solutions they offer. Meetings should have set agendas to avoid them becoming "gripe sessions."

6. Accidents can still occur, so therefore it is necessary to have post-accident procedures in place:

- · Proper first aid training, supplies and emergency medical response communication numbers/procedures posted and easily accessed
- Prompt and thorough <u>accident investigation</u>
- Prompt claims reporting to your insurance company
- A return-to-work program

7. The importance of having proper hiring procedures in place cannot be overstated. All those involved in the selection and interviewing of job candidates should have a thorough understanding of the various hiring stages and what inquiries may legally be made in each stage to be confident that the new hire is physically able to perform the work and will adhere to the company's safety and other requirements. Additionally, to ensure that you know you have properly obtained information about any pre-existing medical conditions or disabilities being brought into the workplace. Applicable employment laws will guide this important step. The employer should seek human resource experts and/or legal counsel to confirm they are complying with the many local, state and federal laws that may apply.

8. Actively solicit, encourage and act on employees' concerns, safety suggestions and ideas.

9. An incentive program might be adopted to motivate improved performance in safety. However, a program should only be implemented after the other elements of your safety program are in place and working. Any incentive program should be meaningful and fair, and it should be evaluated periodically to ensure that it is effective and producing the desired effect. A common complaint about incentive programs is that they tend to suppress reporting of incidents and injuries—something you certainly want to avoid.

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# Safety Zone: Risk Transfer and Certificates of Insurance

## What is Risk Transfer?

Risk transfer is a risk control plan of action or strategy that contractually shifts the risk of doing business from one party to another. An example of this would be a property owner who hires a contractor to provide services for his building rather than hiring his own staff of repair personnel. By doing this, the property owner transfers the risk of potential claims or losses onto the contracting firm hired.

The question now is – what should this property owner request from the contractor hired to ensure that the risk is properly transferred to the contractor? At a minimum, a written agreement that the property owner be included as an Additional Insured on the contractor's own insurance policy and that a Certificate of Insurance (COI) be provided from the contractor's insurer or insurance agent. It should also include that the contractor's insurance for the owner is primary and non-contributory. It is strongly recommended the written contract between the two parties include an indemnification clause that specifies the contractor agrees to hold the property owner harmless, thereby eliminating the risk of the owner's liability for the contractor's operations. When permitted, such terms should also be included within the Additional Insured endorsement.

## What is a Certificate of Insurance?

A Certificate of Insurance is a document used to provide information regarding specific insurance coverage held by an individual organization. This COI provides verification of the individual organization's insurance coverage, lines of coverage and limits of coverage. It provides the name of the insurance company, the policy number(s), the named insured and the policies' effective dates. As a caution, this document is merely a "snapshot in time" – a representation of a single point in time that is issued by the other party.

Though uncommon, a Certificate of Insurance may be potentially fraudulent. The COI should come directly from the other party's agent or insurance carrier rather than from the subcontractor or vendor. The party hiring the vendor or subcontractor should ensure that the name of the insured on the COI exactly matches the name of the vendor or subcontractor hired.

Certificates of Insurance are not enough to protect the assets of a company. To ensure they are properly covered, property owners should have a contract developed between themselves and the vendor or subcontractor hired.

## Contractual Risk Transfer - Redefined

A contractual risk transfer is a non-insurance *contract and/or agreement* between the two parties whereby one agrees to hold another party harmless for specified actions, inactions, injuries or damages and indemnify the owner. A well-drafted risk transfer agreement is one of the most effective ways to ensure risk of loss is properly allocated to the party that both creates the risk and has the ability to control that risk.

All contracts and/or agreements should be formalized as a written contract developed by legal counsel, as the use of the property owner's legal counsel is key to ensuring that liability is adequately controlled. The contract wording should include:

- Hold Harmless Agreement: A clause in the contract that releases one party from consequences or liabilities due to the act of the other party. It is important to note that hold harmless agreements work both ways and you need to ensure that this agreement is in your favor.
- Indemnification: An indemnity agreement ensuring that proper compensation is available for losses or damage.
- Waiver of Subrogation: An endorsement that prohibits an insurance carrier from recovering the money they paid on a claim from a third party that may be negligent.
- Primary and Noncontributory Requirement: An inclusive contractual requirement that requires the vendor's or subcontractor's policy to pay before other applicable primary policies and without seeking contribution from other available insurance.
- Additional Insured Status: The vendor or subcontractor is required to endorse the property owner onto its general liability policy as an "Additional Insured."

## COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE FORM

Various provisions in this policy restrict coverage. Read the entire policy carefully to determine rights, duties and what is and is not covered.

Throughout this policy the words "you" and "your" refer to the Named Insured shown in the Declarations, and any other person or organization qualifying as a Named Insured under this policy. The words "we", "us" and "our" refer to the company providing this insurance.

The word "insured" means any person or organization qualifying as such under Section II – Who Is An Insured.

Other words and phrases that appear in quotation marks have special meaning. Refer to Section  ${\bf V}$  – Definitions.

#### **SECTION I – COVERAGES**

#### COVERAGE A – BODILY INJURY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE LIABILITY

#### 1. Insuring Agreement

- a. We will pay those sums that the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance applies. We will have the right and duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking those damages. However, we will have no duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance does not apply. We may, at our discretion, investigate any "occurrence" and settle any claim or "suit" that may result. But:
  - The amount we will pay for damages is limited as described in Section III – Limits Of Insurance; and
  - (2) Our right and duty to defend ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements under Coverages A or B or medical expenses under Coverage C.

No other obligation or liability to pay sums or perform acts or services is covered unless explicitly provided for under Supplementary Payments – Coverages **A** and **B**.

- **b.** This insurance applies to "bodily injury" and "property damage" only if:
  - The "bodily injury" or "property damage" is caused by an "occurrence" that takes place in the "coverage territory";

- (2) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs during the policy period; and
- (3) Prior to the policy period, no insured listed under Paragraph 1. of Section II – Who Is An Insured and no "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim, knew that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" had occurred, in whole or in part. If such a listed insured or authorized "employee" knew, prior to the policy period, that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurred, then any continuation, change or resumption of such "bodily injury" or "property damage" during or after the policy period will be deemed to have been known prior to the policy period.
- c. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which occurs during the policy period and was not, prior to the policy period, known to have occurred by any insured listed under Paragraph 1. of Section II Who Is An Insured or any "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim, includes any continuation, change or resumption of that "bodily injury" or "property damage" after the end of the policy period.
- Bodily injury" or "property damage" will be deemed to have been known to have occurred at the earliest time when any insured listed under Paragraph 1. of Section II Who Is An Insured or any "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim:
  - (1) Reports all, or any part, of the "bodily injury" or "property damage" to us or any other insurer;
  - (2) Receives a written or verbal demand or claim for damages because of the "bodily injury" or "property damage"; or
  - (3) Becomes aware by any other means that "bodily injury" or "property damage" has occurred or has begun to occur.
- e. Damages because of "bodily injury" include damages claimed by any person or organization for care, loss of services or death resulting at any time from the "bodily injury".

#### 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

#### a. Expected Or Intended Injury

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" expected or intended from the standpoint of the insured. This exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" resulting from the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property.

#### b. Contractual Liability

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which the insured is obligated to pay damages by reason of the assumption of liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages:

- (1) That the insured would have in the absence of the contract or agreement; or
- (2) Assumed in a contract or agreement that is an "insured contract", provided the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs subsequent to the execution of the contract or agreement. Solely for the purposes of liability assumed in an "insured contract", reasonable attorneys' fees and necessary litigation expenses incurred by or for a party other than an insured are deemed to be damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage", provided:
  - (a) Liability to such party for, or for the cost of, that party's defense has also been assumed in the same "insured contract"; and
  - (b) Such attorneys' fees and litigation expenses are for defense of that party against a civil or alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which damages to which this insurance applies are alleged.

#### c. Liquor Liability

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which any insured may be held liable by reason of:

- Causing or contributing to the intoxication of any person;
- (2) The furnishing of alcoholic beverages to a person under the legal drinking age or under the influence of alcohol; or
- (3) Any statute, ordinance or regulation relating to the sale, gift, distribution or use of alcoholic beverages.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in:

- (a) The supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured; or
- (b) Providing or failing to provide transportation with respect to any person that may be under the influence of alcohol;

if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage", involved that which is described in Paragraph (1), (2) or (3) above.

However, this exclusion applies only if you are in the business of manufacturing, distributing, selling, serving or furnishing alcoholic beverages. For the purposes of this exclusion, permitting a person to bring alcoholic beverages on your premises, for consumption on your premises, whether or not a fee is charged or a license is required for such activity, is not by itself considered the business of selling, serving or furnishing alcoholic beverages.

#### d. Workers' Compensation And Similar Laws

Any obligation of the insured under a workers' compensation, disability benefits or unemployment compensation law or any similar law.

#### e. Employer's Liability

"Bodily injury" to:

- (1) An "employee" of the insured arising out of and in the course of:
  - (a) Employment by the insured; or
  - (b) Performing duties related to the conduct of the insured's business; or
- (2) The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph (1) above.

This exclusion applies whether the insured may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity and to any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

This exclusion does not apply to liability assumed by the insured under an "insured contract".

#### f. Pollution

- (1) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "pollutants":
  - (a) At or from any premises, site or location which is or was at any time owned or occupied by, or rented or loaned to, any insured. However, this subparagraph does not apply to:
    - (i) "Bodily injury" if sustained within a building and caused by smoke, fumes, vapor or soot produced by or originating from equipment that is used to heat, cool or dehumidify the building, or equipment that is used to heat water for personal use, by the building's occupants or their guests;
    - (ii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which you may be held liable, if you are a contractor and the owner or lessee of such premises, site or location has been added to your policy as an additional insured with respect to your ongoing operations performed for that additional insured at that premises, site or location and such premises, site or location is not and never was owned or occupied by, or rented or loaned to, any insured, other than that additional insured; or
    - (iii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of heat, smoke or fumes from a "hostile fire";
  - (b) At or from any premises, site or location which is or was at any time used by or for any insured or others for the handling, storage, disposal, processing or treatment of waste;
  - (c) Which are or were at any time transported, handled, stored, treated, disposed of, or processed as waste by or for:
    - (i) Any insured; or
    - (ii) Any person or organization for whom you may be legally responsible; or

- (d) At or from any premises, site or location on which any insured or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on any insured's behalf are performing operations if the "pollutants" are brought on or to the premises, site or location in connection with such operations by such insured, contractor or subcontractor. However, this subparagraph does not apply to:
  - (i) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the escape of fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids which are needed to perform the electrical. normal hydraulic or mechanical functions necessary for the operation of "mobile equipment" or its parts, if such fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids escape from a vehicle part designed to hold, store or receive them. This exception does not apply if the "bodily injury" or "property damage" arises out of the intentional discharge, dispersal or release of the fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids, or if such fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids are brought on or to the premises, site or location with the intent that they be discharged, dispersed or released as part of the operations being performed by such insured, contractor or subcontractor;
  - (ii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" sustained within a building and caused by the release of gases, fumes or vapors from materials brought into that building in connection with operations being performed by you or on your behalf by a contractor or subcontractor; or
  - (iii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of heat, smoke or fumes from a "hostile fire".
- (e) At or from any premises, site or location on which any insured or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on any insured's behalf are performing operations if the operations are to test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants".

- (2) Any loss, cost or expense arising out of any:
  - (a) Request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any insured or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants"; or
  - (b) Claim or suit by or on behalf of a governmental authority for damages because of testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying or neutralizing, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "pollutants".

However, this paragraph does not apply to liability for damages because of "property damage" that the insured would have in the absence of such request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement, or such claim or "suit" by or on behalf of a governmental authority.

#### g. Aircraft, Auto Or Watercraft

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the ownership, maintenance, use or entrustment to others of any aircraft, "auto" or watercraft owned or operated by or rented or loaned to any insured. Use includes operation and "loading or unloading".

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured, if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage" involved the ownership, maintenance, use or entrustment to others of any aircraft, "auto" or watercraft that is owned or operated by or rented or loaned to any insured.

This exclusion does not apply to:

- (1) A watercraft while ashore on premises you own or rent;
- (2) A watercraft you do not own that is:
  - (a) Less than 26 feet long; and
  - (b) Not being used to carry persons or property for a charge;
- (3) Parking an "auto" on, or on the ways next to, premises you own or rent, provided the "auto" is not owned by or rented or loaned to you or the insured;
- (4) Liability assumed under any "insured contract" for the ownership, maintenance or use of aircraft or watercraft; or

- (5) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of:
  - (a) The operation of machinery or equipment that is attached to, or part of, a land vehicle that would qualify under the definition of "mobile equipment" if it were not subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged; or
  - (b) The operation of any of the machinery or equipment listed in Paragraph f.(2) or f.(3) of the definition of "mobile equipment".

#### h. Mobile Equipment

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of:

- (1) The transportation of "mobile equipment" by an "auto" owned or operated by or rented or loaned to any insured; or
- (2) The use of "mobile equipment" in, or while in practice for, or while being prepared for, any prearranged racing, speed, demolition, or stunting activity.
- i. War

"Bodily injury" or "property damage", however caused, arising, directly or indirectly, out of:

- (1) War, including undeclared or civil war;
- (2) Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, sovereign or other authority using military personnel or other agents; or
- (3) Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power, or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or defending against any of these.

#### j. Damage To Property

"Property damage" to:

- (1) Property you own, rent, or occupy, including any costs or expenses incurred by you, or any other person, organization or entity, for repair, replacement, enhancement, restoration or maintenance of such property for any reason, including prevention of injury to a person or damage to another's property;
- (2) Premises you sell, give away or abandon, if the "property damage" arises out of any part of those premises;
- (3) Property loaned to you;

- (4) Personal property in the care, custody or control of the insured;
- (5) That particular part of real property on which you or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on your behalf are performing operations, if the "property damage" arises out of those operations; or
- (6) That particular part of any property that must be restored, repaired or replaced because "your work" was incorrectly performed on it.

Paragraphs (1), (3) and (4) of this exclusion do not apply to "property damage" (other than damage by fire) to premises, including the contents of such premises, rented to you for a period of seven or fewer consecutive days. A separate limit of insurance applies to Damage To Premises Rented To You as described in Section III – Limits Of Insurance.

Paragraph (2) of this exclusion does not apply if the premises are "your work" and were never occupied, rented or held for rental by you.

Paragraphs (3), (4), (5) and (6) of this exclusion do not apply to liability assumed under a sidetrack agreement.

Paragraph (6) of this exclusion does not apply to "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard".

#### k. Damage To Your Product

"Property damage" to "your product" arising out of it or any part of it.

#### I. Damage To Your Work

"Property damage" to "your work" arising out of it or any part of it and included in the "productscompleted operations hazard".

This exclusion does not apply if the damaged work or the work out of which the damage arises was performed on your behalf by a subcontractor.

#### m. Damage To Impaired Property Or Property Not Physically Injured

"Property damage" to "impaired property" or property that has not been physically injured, arising out of:

- (1) A defect, deficiency, inadequacy or dangerous condition in "your product" or "your work"; or
- (2) A delay or failure by you or anyone acting on your behalf to perform a contract or agreement in accordance with its terms.

This exclusion does not apply to the loss of use of other property arising out of sudden and accidental physical injury to "your product" or "your work" after it has been put to its intended use.

#### n. Recall Of Products, Work Or Impaired Property

Damages claimed for any loss, cost or expense incurred by you or others for the loss of use, withdrawal, recall, inspection, repair, replacement, adjustment, removal or disposal of:

(1) "Your product";

(2) "Your work"; or

(3) "Impaired property";

if such product, work, or property is withdrawn or recalled from the market or from use by any person or organization because of a known or suspected defect, deficiency, inadequacy or dangerous condition in it.

#### o. Personal And Advertising Injury

"Bodily injury" arising out of "personal and advertising injury".

#### p. Electronic Data

Damages arising out of the loss of, loss of use of, damage to, corruption of, inability to access, or inability to manipulate electronic data.

However, this exclusion does not apply to liability for damages because of "bodily injury".

As used in this exclusion, electronic data means information, facts or programs stored as or on, created or used on, or transmitted to or from computer software, including systems and applications software, hard or floppy disks, CD-ROMs, tapes, drives, cells, data processing devices or any other media which are used with electronically controlled equipment.

#### q. Recording And Distribution Of Material Or Information In Violation Of Law

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising directly or indirectly out of any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate:

- The Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA), including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (2) The CAN-SPAM Act of 2003, including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (3) The Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), and any amendment of or addition to such law, including the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA); or

(4) Any federal, state or local statute, ordinance or regulation, other than the TCPA, CAN-SPAM Act of 2003 or FCRA and their amendments and additions, that addresses, prohibits, or limits the printing, dissemination, disposal, collecting, recording, sending, transmitting, communicating or distribution of material or information.

Exclusions **c.** through **n.** do not apply to damage by fire to premises while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner. A separate limit of insurance applies to this coverage as described in Section III – Limits Of Insurance.

# COVERAGE B – PERSONAL AND ADVERTISING INJURY LIABILITY

#### 1. Insuring Agreement

- a. We will pay those sums that the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages because of "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance applies. We will have the right and duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking those damages. However, we will have no duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance does not apply. We may, at our discretion, investigate any offense and settle any claim or "suit" that may result. But:
  - The amount we will pay for damages is limited as described in Section III – Limits Of Insurance; and
  - (2) Our right and duty to defend end when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements under Coverages A or B or medical expenses under Coverage C.

No other obligation or liability to pay sums or perform acts or services is covered unless explicitly provided for under Supplementary Payments – Coverages **A** and **B**.

**b.** This insurance applies to "personal and advertising injury" caused by an offense arising out of your business but only if the offense was committed in the "coverage territory" during the policy period.

#### 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

#### a. Knowing Violation Of Rights Of Another

"Personal and advertising injury" caused by or at the direction of the insured with the knowledge that the act would violate the rights of another and would inflict "personal and advertising injury".

#### b. Material Published With Knowledge Of Falsity

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of oral or written publication, in any manner, of material, if done by or at the direction of the insured with knowledge of its falsity.

#### c. Material Published Prior To Policy Period

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of oral or written publication, in any manner, of material whose first publication took place before the beginning of the policy period.

#### d. Criminal Acts

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of a criminal act committed by or at the direction of the insured.

#### e. Contractual Liability

"Personal and advertising injury" for which the insured has assumed liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages that the insured would have in the absence of the contract or agreement.

#### f. Breach Of Contract

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of a breach of contract, except an implied contract to use another's advertising idea in your "advertisement".

#### g. Quality Or Performance Of Goods – Failure To Conform To Statements

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of the failure of goods, products or services to conform with any statement of quality or performance made in your "advertisement".

#### h. Wrong Description Of Prices

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of the wrong description of the price of goods, products or services stated in your "advertisement".

#### i. Infringement Of Copyright, Patent, Trademark Or Trade Secret

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of the infringement of copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret or other intellectual property rights. Under this exclusion, such other intellectual property rights do not include the use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement".

However, this exclusion does not apply to infringement, in your "advertisement", of copyright, trade dress or slogan.

#### j. Insureds In Media And Internet Type Businesses

"Personal and advertising injury" committed by an insured whose business is:

- (1) Advertising, broadcasting, publishing or telecasting;
- (2) Designing or determining content of web sites for others; or
- (3) An Internet search, access, content or service provider.

However, this exclusion does not apply to Paragraphs **14.a., b.** and **c.** of "personal and advertising injury" under the Definitions section.

For the purposes of this exclusion, the placing of frames, borders or links, or advertising, for you or others anywhere on the Internet, is not by itself, considered the business of advertising, broadcasting, publishing or telecasting.

#### k. Electronic Chatrooms Or Bulletin Boards

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of an electronic chatroom or bulletin board the insured hosts, owns, or over which the insured exercises control.

#### I. Unauthorized Use Of Another's Name Or Product

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of the unauthorized use of another's name or product in your e-mail address, domain name or metatag, or any other similar tactics to mislead another's potential customers.

#### m. Pollution

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "pollutants" at any time.

#### n. Pollution-related

Any loss, cost or expense arising out of any:

- (1) Request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any insured or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants"; or
- (2) Claim or suit by or on behalf of a governmental authority for damages because of testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying or neutralizing, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "pollutants".

#### o. War

"Personal and advertising injury", however caused, arising, directly or indirectly, out of:

- (1) War, including undeclared or civil war;
- (2) Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, sovereign or other authority using military personnel or other agents; or
- (3) Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power, or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or defending against any of these.

#### p. Recording And Distribution Of Material Or Information In Violation Of Law

"Personal and advertising injury" arising directly or indirectly out of any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate:

- The Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA), including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (2) The CAN-SPAM Act of 2003, including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (3) The Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), and any amendment of or addition to such law, including the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA); or
- (4) Any federal, state or local statute, ordinance or regulation, other than the TCPA, CAN-SPAM Act of 2003 or FCRA and their amendments and additions, that addresses, prohibits, or limits the printing, dissemination, disposal, collecting, recording, sending, transmitting, communicating or distribution of material or information.

#### COVERAGE C – MEDICAL PAYMENTS

#### 1. Insuring Agreement

- **a.** We will pay medical expenses as described below for "bodily injury" caused by an accident:
  - (1) On premises you own or rent;
  - (2) On ways next to premises you own or rent; or
  - (3) Because of your operations;

provided that:

- (a) The accident takes place in the "coverage territory" and during the policy period;
- (b) The expenses are incurred and reported to us within one year of the date of the accident; and
- (c) The injured person submits to examination, at our expense, by physicians of our choice as often as we reasonably require.
- **b.** We will make these payments regardless of fault. These payments will not exceed the applicable limit of insurance. We will pay reasonable expenses for:
  - (1) First aid administered at the time of an accident;
  - (2) Necessary medical, surgical, X-ray and dental services, including prosthetic devices; and
  - (3) Necessary ambulance, hospital, professional nursing and funeral services.

#### 2. Exclusions

We will not pay expenses for "bodily injury":

#### a. Any Insured

To any insured, except "volunteer workers".

#### b. Hired Person

To a person hired to do work for or on behalf of any insured or a tenant of any insured.

#### c. Injury On Normally Occupied Premises

To a person injured on that part of premises you own or rent that the person normally occupies.

#### d. Workers' Compensation And Similar Laws

To a person, whether or not an "employee" of any insured, if benefits for the "bodily injury" are payable or must be provided under a workers' compensation or disability benefits law or a similar law.

#### e. Athletics Activities

To a person injured while practicing, instructing or participating in any physical exercises or games, sports, or athletic contests.

#### f. Products-Completed Operations Hazard

Included within the "products-completed operations hazard".

#### g. Coverage A Exclusions

Excluded under Coverage A.

# SUPPLEMENTARY PAYMENTS – COVERAGES A AND B

- 1. We will pay, with respect to any claim we investigate or settle, or any "suit" against an insured we defend:
  - a. All expenses we incur.
  - **b.** Up to \$250 for cost of bail bonds required because of accidents or traffic law violations arising out of the use of any vehicle to which the Bodily Injury Liability Coverage applies. We do not have to furnish these bonds.
  - **c.** The cost of bonds to release attachments, but only for bond amounts within the applicable limit of insurance. We do not have to furnish these bonds.
  - **d.** All reasonable expenses incurred by the insured at our request to assist us in the investigation or defense of the claim or "suit", including actual loss of earnings up to \$250 a day because of time off from work.
  - e. All court costs taxed against the insured in the "suit". However, these payments do not include attorneys' fees or attorneys' expenses taxed against the insured.
  - f. Prejudgment interest awarded against the insured on that part of the judgment we pay. If we make an offer to pay the applicable limit of insurance, we will not pay any prejudgment interest based on that period of time after the offer.

**g.** All interest on the full amount of any judgment that accrues after entry of the judgment and before we have paid, offered to pay, or deposited in court the part of the judgment that is within the applicable limit of insurance.

These payments will not reduce the limits of insurance.

- 2. If we defend an insured against a "suit" and an indemnitee of the insured is also named as a party to the "suit", we will defend that indemnitee if all of the following conditions are met:
  - **a.** The "suit" against the indemnitee seeks damages for which the insured has assumed the liability of the indemnitee in a contract or agreement that is an "insured contract";
  - **b.** This insurance applies to such liability assumed by the insured;
  - c. The obligation to defend, or the cost of the defense of, that indemnitee, has also been assumed by the insured in the same "insured contract";
  - d. The allegations in the "suit" and the information we know about the "occurrence" are such that no conflict appears to exist between the interests of the insured and the interests of the indemnitee;
  - e. The indemnitee and the insured ask us to conduct and control the defense of that indemnitee against such "suit" and agree that we can assign the same counsel to defend the insured and the indemnitee; and
  - f. The indemnitee:
    - (1) Agrees in writing to:
      - (a) Cooperate with us in the investigation, settlement or defense of the "suit";
      - (b) Immediately send us copies of any demands, notices, summonses or legal papers received in connection with the "suit";
      - (c) Notify any other insurer whose coverage is available to the indemnitee; and
      - (d) Cooperate with us with respect to coordinating other applicable insurance available to the indemnitee; and
    - (2) Provides us with written authorization to:
      - (a) Obtain records and other information related to the "suit"; and
      - (b) Conduct and control the defense of the indemnitee in such "suit".

So long as the above conditions are met, attorneys' fees incurred by us in the defense of that indemnitee, necessary litigation expenses incurred by us and necessary litigation expenses incurred by the indemnitee at our request will be paid as Supplementary Payments. Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph **2.b.(2)** of Section I – Coverage A – Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability, such payments will not be deemed to be damages for "bodily injury" and "property damage" and will not reduce the limits of insurance.

Our obligation to defend an insured's indemnitee and to pay for attorneys' fees and necessary litigation expenses as Supplementary Payments ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements or the conditions set forth above, or the terms of the agreement described in Paragraph **f.** above, are no longer met.

#### SECTION II - WHO IS AN INSURED

1. If you are designated in the Declarations as:

- **a.** An individual, you and your spouse are insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of a business of which you are the sole owner.
- **b.** A partnership or joint venture, you are an insured. Your members, your partners, and their spouses are also insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of your business.
- **c.** A limited liability company, you are an insured. Your members are also insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of your business. Your managers are insureds, but only with respect to their duties as your managers.
- d. An organization other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company, you are an insured. Your "executive officers" and directors are insureds, but only with respect to their duties as your officers or directors. Your stockholders are also insureds, but only with respect to their liability as stockholders.
- e. A trust, you are an insured. Your trustees are also insureds, but only with respect to their duties as trustees.

- 2. Each of the following is also an insured:
  - a. Your "volunteer workers" only while performing duties related to the conduct of your business, or your "employees", other than either your "executive officers" (if you are an organization other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company) or your managers (if you are a limited liability company), but only for acts within the scope of their employment by you or while performing duties related to the conduct of your business. However, none of these "employees" or "volunteer workers" are insureds for:
    - (1) "Bodily injury" or "personal and advertising injury":
      - (a) To you, to your partners or members (if you are a partnership or joint venture), to your members (if you are a limited liability company), to a co-"employee" while in the course of his or her employment or performing duties related to the conduct of your business, or to your other "volunteer workers" while performing duties related to the conduct of your business;
      - (b) To the spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that co-"employee" or "volunteer worker" as a consequence of Paragraph (1)(a) above;
      - (c) For which there is any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury described in Paragraph (1)(a) or (b) above; or
      - (d) Arising out of his or her providing or failing to provide professional health care services.
    - (2) "Property damage" to property:
      - (a) Owned, occupied or used by;
      - (b) Rented to, in the care, custody or control of, or over which physical control is being exercised for any purpose by;

you, any of your "employees", "volunteer workers", any partner or member (if you are a partnership or joint venture), or any member (if you are a limited liability company).

**b.** Any person (other than your "employee" or "volunteer worker"), or any organization while acting as your real estate manager.

- c. Any person or organization having proper temporary custody of your property if you die, but only:
  - (1) With respect to liability arising out of the maintenance or use of that property; and
  - (2) Until your legal representative has been appointed.
- **d.** Your legal representative if you die, but only with respect to duties as such. That representative will have all your rights and duties under this Coverage Part.
- **3.** Any organization you newly acquire or form, other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company, and over which you maintain ownership or majority interest, will qualify as a Named Insured if there is no other similar insurance available to that organization. However:
  - Coverage under this provision is afforded only until the 90th day after you acquire or form the organization or the end of the policy period, whichever is earlier;
  - b. Coverage A does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization; and
  - **c.** Coverage **B** does not apply to "personal and advertising injury" arising out of an offense committed before you acquired or formed the organization.

No person or organization is an insured with respect to the conduct of any current or past partnership, joint venture or limited liability company that is not shown as a Named Insured in the Declarations.

#### SECTION III - LIMITS OF INSURANCE

- 1. The Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations and the rules below fix the most we will pay regardless of the number of:
  - a. Insureds;
  - b. Claims made or "suits" brought; or
  - **c.** Persons or organizations making claims or bringing "suits".
- 2. The General Aggregate Limit is the most we will pay for the sum of:
  - a. Medical expenses under Coverage C;
  - b. Damages under Coverage A, except damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard"; and
  - c. Damages under Coverage B.

- 3. The Products-Completed Operations Aggregate Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage A for damages because of "bodily injury" and "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard".
- 4. Subject to Paragraph 2. above, the Personal And Advertising Injury Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage B for the sum of all damages because of all "personal and advertising injury" sustained by any one person or organization.
- 5. Subject to Paragraph 2. or 3. above, whichever applies, the Each Occurrence Limit is the most we will pay for the sum of:
  - a. Damages under Coverage A; and
  - b. Medical expenses under Coverage C

because of all "bodily injury" and "property damage" arising out of any one "occurrence".

- 6. Subject to Paragraph 5. above, the Damage To Premises Rented To You Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage A for damages because of "property damage" to any one premises, while rented to you, or in the case of damage by fire, while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner.
- 7. Subject to Paragraph 5. above, the Medical Expense Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage C for all medical expenses because of "bodily injury" sustained by any one person.

The Limits of Insurance of this Coverage Part apply separately to each consecutive annual period and to any remaining period of less than 12 months, starting with the beginning of the policy period shown in the Declarations, unless the policy period is extended after issuance for an additional period of less than 12 months. In that case, the additional period will be deemed part of the last preceding period for purposes of determining the Limits of Insurance.

# SECTION IV – COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY CONDITIONS

#### 1. Bankruptcy

Bankruptcy or insolvency of the insured or of the insured's estate will not relieve us of our obligations under this Coverage Part.

- 2. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Offense, Claim Or Suit
  - a. You must see to it that we are notified as soon as practicable of an "occurrence" or an offense which may result in a claim. To the extent possible, notice should include:
    - (1) How, when and where the "occurrence" or offense took place;
    - (2) The names and addresses of any injured persons and witnesses; and

- (3) The nature and location of any injury or damage arising out of the "occurrence" or offense.
- **b.** If a claim is made or "suit" is brought against any insured, you must:
  - (1) Immediately record the specifics of the claim or "suit" and the date received; and
  - (2) Notify us as soon as practicable.

You must see to it that we receive written notice of the claim or "suit" as soon as practicable.

- c. You and any other involved insured must:
  - (1) Immediately send us copies of any demands, notices, summonses or legal papers received in connection with the claim or "suit";
  - (2) Authorize us to obtain records and other information;
  - (3) Cooperate with us in the investigation or settlement of the claim or defense against the "suit"; and
  - (4) Assist us, upon our request, in the enforcement of any right against any person or organization which may be liable to the insured because of injury or damage to which this insurance may also apply.
- **d.** No insured will, except at that insured's own cost, voluntarily make a payment, assume any obligation, or incur any expense, other than for first aid, without our consent.

#### 3. Legal Action Against Us

No person or organization has a right under this Coverage Part:

- a. To join us as a party or otherwise bring us into a "suit" asking for damages from an insured; or
- **b.** To sue us on this Coverage Part unless all of its terms have been fully complied with.

A person or organization may sue us to recover on an agreed settlement or on a final judgment against an insured; but we will not be liable for damages that are not payable under the terms of this Coverage Part or that are in excess of the applicable limit of insurance. An agreed settlement means a settlement and release of liability signed by us, the insured and the claimant or the claimant's legal representative.

#### 4. Other Insurance

If other valid and collectible insurance is available to the insured for a loss we cover under Coverages **A** or **B** of this Coverage Part, our obligations are limited as follows:

#### a. Primary Insurance

This insurance is primary except when Paragraph **b.** below applies. If this insurance is primary, our obligations are not affected unless any of the other insurance is also primary. Then, we will share with all that other insurance by the method described in Paragraph **c.** below.

#### b. Excess Insurance

- (1) This insurance is excess over:
  - (a) Any of the other insurance, whether primary, excess, contingent or on any other basis:
    - (i) That is Fire, Extended Coverage, Builder's Risk, Installation Risk or similar coverage for "your work";
    - (ii) That is Fire insurance for premises rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner;
    - (iii) That is insurance purchased by you to cover your liability as a tenant for "property damage" to premises rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner; or
    - (iv) If the loss arises out of the maintenance or use of aircraft, "autos" or watercraft to the extent not subject to Exclusion g. of Section I Coverage A Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability.
  - (b) Any other primary insurance available to you covering liability for damages arising out of the premises or operations, or the products and completed operations, for which you have been added as an additional insured.
- (2) When this insurance is excess, we will have no duty under Coverages A or B to defend the insured against any "suit" if any other insurer has a duty to defend the insured against that "suit". If no other insurer defends, we will undertake to do so, but we will be entitled to the insured's rights against all those other insurers.

- (3) When this insurance is excess over other insurance, we will pay only our share of the amount of the loss, if any, that exceeds the sum of:
  - (a) The total amount that all such other insurance would pay for the loss in the absence of this insurance; and
  - (b) The total of all deductible and selfinsured amounts under all that other insurance.
- (4) We will share the remaining loss, if any, with any other insurance that is not described in this Excess Insurance provision and was not bought specifically to apply in excess of the Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations of this Coverage Part.

#### c. Method Of Sharing

If all of the other insurance permits contribution by equal shares, we will follow this method also. Under this approach each insurer contributes equal amounts until it has paid its applicable limit of insurance or none of the loss remains, whichever comes first.

If any of the other insurance does not permit contribution by equal shares, we will contribute by limits. Under this method, each insurer's share is based on the ratio of its applicable limit of insurance to the total applicable limits of insurance of all insurers.

#### 5. Premium Audit

- **a.** We will compute all premiums for this Coverage Part in accordance with our rules and rates.
- **b.** Premium shown in this Coverage Part as advance premium is a deposit premium only. At the close of each audit period we will compute the earned premium for that period and send notice to the first Named Insured. The due date for audit and retrospective premiums is the date shown as the due date on the bill. If the sum of the advance and audit premiums paid for the policy period is greater than the earned premium, we will return the excess to the first Named Insured.
- c. The first Named Insured must keep records of the information we need for premium computation, and send us copies at such times as we may request.

#### 6. Representations

By accepting this policy, you agree:

a. The statements in the Declarations are accurate and complete;

- **b.** Those statements are based upon representations you made to us; and
- **c.** We have issued this policy in reliance upon your representations.

#### 7. Separation Of Insureds

Except with respect to the Limits of Insurance, and any rights or duties specifically assigned in this Coverage Part to the first Named Insured, this insurance applies:

- a. As if each Named Insured were the only Named Insured; and
- **b.** Separately to each insured against whom claim is made or "suit" is brought.
- 8. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us

If the insured has rights to recover all or part of any payment we have made under this Coverage Part, those rights are transferred to us. The insured must do nothing after loss to impair them. At our request, the insured will bring "suit" or transfer those rights to us and help us enforce them.

#### 9. When We Do Not Renew

If we decide not to renew this Coverage Part, we will mail or deliver to the first Named Insured shown in the Declarations written notice of the nonrenewal not less than 30 days before the expiration date.

If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

#### **SECTION V – DEFINITIONS**

- "Advertisement" means a notice that is broadcast or published to the general public or specific market segments about your goods, products or services for the purpose of attracting customers or supporters. For the purposes of this definition:
  - **a.** Notices that are published include material placed on the Internet or on similar electronic means of communication; and
  - b. Regarding web sites, only that part of a web site that is about your goods, products or services for the purposes of attracting customers or supporters is considered an advertisement.
- 2. "Auto" means:
  - **a.** A land motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer designed for travel on public roads, including any attached machinery or equipment; or
  - **b.** Any other land vehicle that is subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged.

However, "auto" does not include "mobile equipment".

- **3.** "Bodily injury" means bodily injury, sickness or disease sustained by a person, including death resulting from any of these at any time.
- 4. "Coverage territory" means:
  - a. The United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Puerto Rico and Canada;
  - **b.** International waters or airspace, but only if the injury or damage occurs in the course of travel or transportation between any places included in Paragraph **a.** above; or
  - **c.** All other parts of the world if the injury or damage arises out of:
    - Goods or products made or sold by you in the territory described in Paragraph a. above;
    - (2) The activities of a person whose home is in the territory described in Paragraph **a**. above, but is away for a short time on your business; or
    - (3) "Personal and advertising injury" offenses that take place through the Internet or similar electronic means of communication;

provided the insured's responsibility to pay damages is determined in a "suit" on the merits, in the territory described in Paragraph **a.** above or in a settlement we agree to.

- 5. "Employee" includes a "leased worker". "Employee" does not include a "temporary worker".
- 6. "Executive officer" means a person holding any of the officer positions created by your charter, constitution, bylaws or any other similar governing document.
- 7. "Hostile fire" means one which becomes uncontrollable or breaks out from where it was intended to be.
- 8. "Impaired property" means tangible property, other than "your product" or "your work", that cannot be used or is less useful because:
  - a. It incorporates "your product" or "your work" that is known or thought to be defective, deficient, inadequate or dangerous; or
  - **b.** You have failed to fulfill the terms of a contract or agreement;

if such property can be restored to use by the repair, replacement, adjustment or removal of "your product" or "your work" or your fulfilling the terms of the contract or agreement.

- 9. "Insured contract" means:
  - a. A contract for a lease of premises. However, that portion of the contract for a lease of premises that indemnifies any person or organization for damage by fire to premises while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner is not an "insured contract";
  - **b.** A sidetrack agreement;
  - c. Any easement or license agreement, except in connection with construction or demolition operations on or within 50 feet of a railroad;
  - An obligation, as required by ordinance, to indemnify a municipality, except in connection with work for a municipality;
  - e. An elevator maintenance agreement;
  - f. That part of any other contract or agreement pertaining to your business (including an indemnification of a municipality in connection with work performed for a municipality) under which you assume the tort liability of another party to pay for "bodily injury" or "property damage" to a third person or organization. Tort liability means a liability that would be imposed by law in the absence of any contract or agreement.

Paragraph **f.** does not include that part of any contract or agreement:

- (1) That indemnifies a railroad for "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of construction or demolition operations, within 50 feet of any railroad property and affecting any railroad bridge or trestle, tracks, road-beds, tunnel, underpass or crossing;
- (2) That indemnifies an architect, engineer or surveyor for injury or damage arising out of:
  - (a) Preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve, maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings and specifications; or
  - (b) Giving directions or instructions, or failing to give them, if that is the primary cause of the injury or damage; or
- (3) Under which the insured, if an architect, engineer or surveyor, assumes liability for an injury or damage arising out of the insured's rendering or failure to render professional services, including those listed in (2) above and supervisory, inspection, architectural or engineering activities.

- 10. "Leased worker" means a person leased to you by a labor leasing firm under an agreement between you and the labor leasing firm, to perform duties related to the conduct of your business. "Leased worker" does not include a "temporary worker".
- **11.** "Loading or unloading" means the handling of property:
  - After it is moved from the place where it is accepted for movement into or onto an aircraft, watercraft or "auto";
  - b. While it is in or on an aircraft, watercraft or "auto"; or
  - While it is being moved from an aircraft, watercraft or "auto" to the place where it is finally delivered;

but "loading or unloading" does not include the movement of property by means of a mechanical device, other than a hand truck, that is not attached to the aircraft, watercraft or "auto".

- **12.** "Mobile equipment" means any of the following types of land vehicles, including any attached machinery or equipment:
  - Bulldozers, farm machinery, forklifts and other vehicles designed for use principally off public roads;
  - **b.** Vehicles maintained for use solely on or next to premises you own or rent;
  - c. Vehicles that travel on crawler treads;
  - **d.** Vehicles, whether self-propelled or not, maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently mounted:
    - (1) Power cranes, shovels, loaders, diggers or drills; or
    - (2) Road construction or resurfacing equipment such as graders, scrapers or rollers;
  - e. Vehicles not described in Paragraph a., b., c. or d. above that are not self-propelled and are maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently attached equipment of the following types:
    - (1) Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting and well servicing equipment; or
    - (2) Cherry pickers and similar devices used to raise or lower workers;
  - f. Vehicles not described in Paragraph a., b., c. or d. above maintained primarily for purposes other than the transportation of persons or cargo.

However, self-propelled vehicles with the following types of permanently attached equipment are not "mobile equipment" but will be considered "autos":

- (1) Equipment designed primarily for:
  - (a) Snow removal;
  - (b) Road maintenance, but not construction or resurfacing; or
  - (c) Street cleaning;
- (2) Cherry pickers and similar devices mounted on automobile or truck chassis and used to raise or lower workers; and
- (3) Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting and well servicing equipment.

However, "mobile equipment" does not include any land vehicles that are subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged. Land vehicles subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law are considered "autos".

- **13.** "Occurrence" means an accident, including continuous or repeated exposure to substantially the same general harmful conditions.
- **14.** "Personal and advertising injury" means injury, including consequential "bodily injury", arising out of one or more of the following offenses:
  - a. False arrest, detention or imprisonment;
  - b. Malicious prosecution;
  - c. The wrongful eviction from, wrongful entry into, or invasion of the right of private occupancy of a room, dwelling or premises that a person occupies, committed by or on behalf of its owner, landlord or lessor;
  - d. Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that slanders or libels a person or organization or disparages a person's or organization's goods, products or services;
  - e. Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that violates a person's right of privacy;
  - f. The use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement"; or
  - **g.** Infringing upon another's copyright, trade dress or slogan in your "advertisement".
- **15.** "Pollutants" mean any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, acids, alkalis, chemicals and waste. Waste includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reclaimed.

- 16. "Products-completed operations hazard":
  - a. Includes all "bodily injury" and "property damage" occurring away from premises you own or rent and arising out of "your product" or "your work" except:
    - (1) Products that are still in your physical possession; or
    - (2) Work that has not yet been completed or abandoned. However, "your work" will be deemed completed at the earliest of the following times:
      - (a) When all of the work called for in your contract has been completed.
      - (b) When all of the work to be done at the job site has been completed if your contract calls for work at more than one job site.
      - (c) When that part of the work done at a job site has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor working on the same project.

Work that may need service, maintenance, correction, repair or replacement, but which is otherwise complete, will be treated as completed.

- **b.** Does not include "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of:
  - (1) The transportation of property, unless the injury or damage arises out of a condition in or on a vehicle not owned or operated by you, and that condition was created by the "loading or unloading" of that vehicle by any insured;
  - (2) The existence of tools, uninstalled equipment or abandoned or unused materials; or
  - (3) Products or operations for which the classification, listed in the Declarations or in a policy Schedule, states that products-completed operations are subject to the General Aggregate Limit.
- **17.** "Property damage" means:
  - a. Physical injury to tangible property, including all resulting loss of use of that property. All such loss of use shall be deemed to occur at the time of the physical injury that caused it; or
  - **b.** Loss of use of tangible property that is not physically injured. All such loss of use shall be deemed to occur at the time of the "occurrence" that caused it.

For the purposes of this insurance, electronic data is not tangible property.

As used in this definition, electronic data means information, facts or programs stored as or on, created or used on, or transmitted to or from computer software, including systems and applications software, hard or floppy disks, CD-ROMs, tapes, drives, cells, data processing devices or any other media which are used with electronically controlled equipment.

- **18.** "Suit" means a civil proceeding in which damages because of "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance applies are alleged. "Suit" includes:
  - An arbitration proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured must submit or does submit with our consent; or
  - **b.** Any other alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured submits with our consent.
- **19.** "Temporary worker" means a person who is furnished to you to substitute for a permanent "employee" on leave or to meet seasonal or short-term workload conditions.
- **20.** "Volunteer worker" means a person who is not your "employee", and who donates his or her work and acts at the direction of and within the scope of duties determined by you, and is not paid a fee, salary or other compensation by you or anyone else for their work performed for you.

      - (a) You;
      - (b) Others trading under your name; or
      - (c) A person or organization whose business or assets you have acquired; and
    - (2) Containers (other than vehicles), materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such goods or products.

- b. Includes:
  - (1) Warranties or representations made at any time with respect to the fitness, quality, durability, performance or use of "your product"; and
  - (2) The providing of or failure to provide warnings or instructions.
- **c.** Does not include vending machines or other property rented to or located for the use of others but not sold.
- 22. "Your work":
  - a. Means:
    - (1) Work or operations performed by you or on your behalf; and
    - (2) Materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.
  - **b.** Includes:
    - (1) Warranties or representations made at any time with respect to the fitness, quality, durability, performance or use of "your work"; and
    - (2) The providing of or failure to provide warnings or instructions.

Any loss, cost or expenses arising out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "fungi" or bacteria, by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This exclusion does not apply to any "fungi" or bacteria that are, are on, or are contained in, a good or product intended for bodily consumption. B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.

**A.** The following exclusion is added:

This insurance does not apply to:

#### TERRORISM

"Any injury or damage" arising, directly or indirectly, out of a "certified act of terrorism".

- **B.** The following definitions are added:
  - 1. For the purposes of this endorsement, "any injury or damage" means any injury or damage covered under any Coverage Part to which this endorsement is applicable, and includes but is not limited to "bodily injury", "property damage", "personal and advertising injury", "injury" or "environmental damage" as may be defined in any applicable Coverage Part.
  - 2. "Certified act of terrorism" means an act that is certified by the Secretary of the Treasury, in accordance with the provisions of the federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, to be an act of terrorism pursuant to such Act. The criteria contained in the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act for a "certified act of terrorism" include the following:
    - **a.** The act resulted in insured losses in excess of \$5 million in the aggregate, attributable to all types of insurance subject to the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act; and

- **b.** The act is a violent act or an act that is dangerous to human life, property or infrastructure and is committed by an individual or individuals as part of an effort to coerce the civilian population of the United States or to influence the policy or affect the conduct of the United States Government by coercion.
- **C.** The terms and limitations of any terrorism exclusion, or the inapplicability or omission of a terrorism exclusion, do not serve to create coverage for injury or damage that is otherwise excluded under this Coverage Part.

### EXCLUSION – ELECTRONIC DATA – DELETION OF BODILY INJURY EXCEPTION

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE PART

The second paragraph ("However, this exclusion does not apply. . .") of Paragraph **p. Electronic Data** under **2. Exclusions** of **Section I – Coverage A – Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability** is deleted.

- A. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.

  - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

# Perfluoroalkyl And Polyfluoroalkyl Substances

- a. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which would not have occurred, in whole or in part, but for the actual, alleged, threatened or suspected inhalation, ingestion, absorption. consumption. discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, any "perfluoroalkyl polyfluoroalkyl or substances".
- b. Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, "perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

- B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.
   Exclusions of Section I Coverage B Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:
  - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

# Perfluoroalkyl And Polyfluoroalkyl Substances

- a. "Personal and advertising injury" which would not have taken place, in whole or in part, but for the actual, alleged, threatened or suspected inhalation, ingestion, absorption. consumption. discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, any "perfluoroalkyl polyfluoroalkyl or substances".
- b. Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, "perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

**C.** The following definition is added to the **Definitions** Section:

"Perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances" means any:

- Chemical or substance that contains one or more alkyl carbons on which hydrogen atoms have been partially or completely replaced by fluorine atoms, including but not limited to:
  - **a.** Polymer, oligomer, monomer or nonpolymer chemicals and their homologues, isomers, telomers, salts, derivatives, precursor chemicals, degradation products or by-products;
- **b.** Perfluoroalkyl acids (PFAA), such as perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and its salts, or perfluorooctane sulfonic acid (PFOS) and its salts;
- c. Perfluoropolyethers (PFPE);
- d. Fluorotelomer-based substances; or
- e. Side-chain fluorinated polymers; or
- **2.** Good or product, including containers, materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such goods or products, that consists of or contains any chemical or substance described in Paragraph **C.1**.

## **EXCLUSION – CYBER INCIDENT**

A. The following is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I – Coverage A – Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability:

#### 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

#### Cyber Incident

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of a "cyber incident".

This exclusion applies even if damages are claimed for notification costs, credit or identity monitoring expenses, forensic expenses, public relations expenses, data restoration expenses, extortion expenses or any other similar cost or expense incurred by you or others arising out of a "cyber incident".

- B. The following is added to Paragraph 2.
   Exclusions of Section I Coverage B Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:
  - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

#### **Cyber Incident**

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of a "cyber incident".

This exclusion applies even if damages are claimed for notification costs, credit or identity monitoring expenses, forensic expenses, public relations expenses, data restoration expenses, extortion expenses or any other similar cost or expense incurred by you or others arising out of a "cyber incident". **C.** For the purposes of this endorsement, the following definition is added to the **Definitions** Section:

- 1. Unauthorized access to or use of any computer system.

Malicious code, virus or any other harmful code that is directed at, enacted upon or introduced into any computer system and is designed to access, alter, corrupt, damage, delete, destroy, disrupt, encrypt, exploit, use or prevent or restrict access to or the use of any part of any computer system or otherwise disrupt its normal functioning or operation.
- **3.** Denial of service attack which disrupts, prevents or restricts access to or use of any computer system, or otherwise disrupts its normal functioning or operation.

When this endorsement is attached to your policy:

- Coverage is restricted to exclude bodily injury or property damage arising, directly or indirectly, out of any fungi, including but not limited to mold, or bacteria on or in a building or structure.
- If applicable, coverage is clarified to exclude personal and advertising injury arising, directly or indirectly, out of any fungi, including but not limited to mold, or bacteria on or in a building or structure.
- Coverage is restricted to exclude clean-up costs associated with fungi or bacteria.
- This exclusion applies whether or not any other cause, event, material or product contributed in any sequence to the injury or damage (N/A in NH, WA).

- Coverage currently provided by your policy for bodily injury or property damage arising, directly or indirectly, out of any fungi, including but not limited to mold, or bacteria on or in a building or structure is now subject to a specific aggregate limit, which is subject to and may be less than the current policy limits.
- If applicable, coverage is clarified to exclude personal and advertising injury arising, directly or indirectly, out of any fungi, including but not limited to mold, or bacteria on or in a building or structure.

# GENERAL LIABILITY ENHANCEMENT ENDORSEMENT

This Endorsment modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE FORM

#### I. Section I - Coverages - Coverage A – Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability

- A. Paragraph 2. Exclusions is amended as follows:
  - 1. Exclusion 2.a. Expected Or Intended Injury is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:

#### a. Expected Or Intended Injury

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" expected or intended from the standpoint of the insured. This exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property.

- 2. Exclusion 2.g. Aircraft, Auto Or Watercraft, subparagraph (2) is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:
  - (2) A watercraft you do not own that is:
    - (a) Less than 51 feet long; and
    - (b) Not being used to carry persons or property for a charge.

This provision applies to any person, who with your consent, either uses or is responsible for the use of a watercraft. This insurance is excess over any other valid and collectible insurance available to the insured whether primary, excess, or contingent.

- 3. Paragraph j.(2) of Damage To Property is deleted.
- 4. Paragraph j.(4) of Damage To Property is deleted and replaced as follows:
  - (4) Personal property in the care, custody or control of the insured which exceeds \$50,000 regardless of the number of:
    - (a) Insureds;
    - (b) Claims made; or
    - (c) Persons or organizations making claims.

The most we will pay under this coverage is \$50,000. Our duty to pay and defend ends under this coverage when the coverage limit has been exhausted.

- 5. Paragraph n. Recall Of Products, Work Or Impaired Property is replaced as follows:
  - **n.** Damages claimed for any loss, costs or expense incurred by you or others for the loss of use, withdrawal, recall, inspection, repair, replacement, adjustment, removal or disposal of:
    - (1) "Your product";
    - (2) "Your work"; or
    - (3) "Impaired Property";

if such product, work, or property is withdrawn or recalled from the market or from use by any person or organization because of a known or suspected defect, deficiency, inadequacy or dangerous condition in it, but this exclusion does not apply to "product recall expenses" that you incur for the "covered recall" of "your product".

This insurance does not apply to "Product Recall Expense" arising out of or resulting from:

- (a) Any product withdrawal initiated due to:
  - i. The failure of "your products" to accomplish their intended purpose, including any breach of warranty of fitness, whether written or implied. This exclusion does not apply if such failure has caused or is reasonably expected to cause "bodily injury" or physical damage to tangible property.

- ii. Copyright, patent, trade secret or trademark infringements;
- iii. Transformation of a chemical nature, deterioration or decomposition of "your product", except if it is caused by:
  - (i) An error in manufacturing, design, processing or transportation of "your product"; or
  - (ii) "Product tampering"
- iv. Expiration of the designated shelf life of "your product".
- (b) A product withdrawal, initiated because of a defect in "your product" known to exist by the Named Insured or the Named Insured's "executive officers", prior to the inception date of this Coverage Part or prior to the time "your product" leaves your control or possession.
- (c) Recall of any specific products for which "bodily injury" or "property damage" is excluded under **Coverage A** by endorsement.
- (d) Recall of "your products" which have been banned from the market by an authorized government entity prior to the policy period.
- (e) The defense of a claim or "suit" against you for "product recall expenses".
- (f) **Coverage A** does not apply to "product recall expense" arising out of any withdrawal or recall that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization.

We will not pay more than \$100,000 annually for "product recall expenses" incurred from all "Covered Recall" events covered during this policy term.

B. Paragraph 2. Exclusions is amended to add the following:

#### 1. Fire, Lightning, Explosion and Sprinkler Leakage

If Damage To Premises Rented To You is not excluded under the policy the following applies:

a. The last subparagraph of Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I – Coverages, Coverage A Bodily Injury And Property Damage is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:

Exclusions **c.** through **n.** do not apply to damage by fire, lightning, explosion or "sprinkler leakage" to premises while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with the permission of the owner. A separate limit of insurance applies to this coverage as described in **Section III** – **Limits of Insurance**.

- b. Paragraph 6. of Section III Limits of Insurance is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:
  - 6. Subject to Paragraph 5. above, the Damage To Premises Rented To You Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage A for damages because of "property damage" to any one premises, while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner, arising out of damage by fire, lightning, explosion or "sprinkler leakage".
- **c.** Subject to all the terms of **Section III Limits of Insurance**, the Damage To Premises Rented To You Limit is the greater of:
  - (1) \$300,000; or
  - (2) The amount shown in the Declarations for Damage To Premises Rented To You Limit
- d. Paragraph 4.b.(1)(ii) of Section IV Commercial General Liability Conditions is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:
  - (ii) That is Fire, Lightning, Explosion, "Sprinkler Leakage" or any similar insurance coverage for premises rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner;

#### 2. Limited Professional Liability

This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage", "personal and advertising injury" arising out of the rendering of or failure to render any "professional services" by you, but only with respect to your providing engineering, architectural or surveying services in your capacity as an engineer, architect or surveyor.

#### II. Section I - Coverages - Coverage B – Personal and Advertising Injury Liability

- A. Paragraph e. Contractual Liability of 2. Exclusions is deleted.
- B. Paragraph 2. Exclusions is amended to add:

#### **Limited Professional Liability**

This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage", "personal and advertising injury" arising out of the rendering of or failure to render any "professional services" by you, but only with respect to your providing engineering, architectural surveying services in your capacity as an engineer, architect or surveyor.

#### III. Coverage C – Medical Payments

Paragraph **1.a.(3)(b)**, is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:

(b) The expenses are incurred and reported to us within two years of the date of the accident; However, expenses reported to us after two years of the date of the accident will not be denied solely because of the late submission unless such late submission operates to prejudice our rights; and

#### **IV. Supplementary Payments-Coverages A and B**

- A. Paragraph 1.b. is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:
  - **b.** Up to \$2,500 for cost of bail bonds required because of accidents or traffic law violations arising out of the use of any vehicle to which the Bodily Injury Liability Coverage applies. We do not have to furnish these bonds.
- B. Paragraph d. is deleted and replaced as follows:
  - **d**. All reasonable expenses incurred by the insured at our request to assist us in the investigation or defense of the claim or "suit", including actual loss of earnings up to \$300 a day because of time off from work

#### V. Aggregate Per Location

This Coverage Extension does not apply if CG 25 03 Designated Construction Project(s) General Aggregate Limit or CG 25 04 Designated Location(s) General Aggregate Limit are attached to this policy.

The limits shown in the Declarations for Each Occurrence, Damage To Premises Rented To You, Medical Expense and General Aggregate apply per "location" or construction project.

- For all sums which the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages caused by "occurrences" under Section I - Coverages, Coverage A Bodily Injury And Property Damage, and for all medical expenses caused by accidents under Section I- Coverages, Coverage C - Medical Payments, which can be attributed only to ongoing operations at a "location" or single construction project:
  - **a.** The most we will pay will be capped at \$5,000,000, regardless of the number of:
    - (1) "Occurrences";
    - (2) Insureds;
    - (3) Claims made or "suits" brought;
    - (4) Persons or organizations making claims or bringing "suits";
    - (5) Locations; or
    - (6) Construction projects.
  - **b.** Subject to **V.1.a.** above:
    - (1) The General Aggregate Limit shown in the Declarations applies separately to each "location" or construction project.
    - (2) Any payments made under Section I Coverages, Coverage A- Bodily Injury And Property Damage for damages or under Section I - Coverages, Coverage C - Medical Payments for medical expenses shall reduce the General Aggregate Limit for that "location" or construction project. Such payments shall not reduce the General Aggregate Limit for any other "location" or construction project.
    - (3) The limits shown in the Declarations for Each Occurrence, Damage To Premises Rented To You and Medical Expense continue to apply to each "location" or construction project, subject to the

General Aggregate Limit.

- 2. For all sums which the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages caused by "occurrences" under Section I Coverages, Coverage A-Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability, and for all medical expenses caused by accidents under Section I Coverages, Coverage C Medical Payments, which cannot be attributed only to a "location" or ongoing operations at a single construction project, any payments made under Coverage A for damages or under Coverage C for medical expenses shall reduce the amount available under the General Aggregate Limit or the Products Completed Operations Aggregate Limit, whichever is applicable. This reduction is not applicable to any identifiable "location" or identifiable construction project.
- 3. When coverage for liability arising out of the "products-completed operations hazard" is provided, any payments for damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard" will reduce the Products-Completed Operations Aggregate Limit, and not reduce the General Aggregate Limit.
- 4. If a construction project has been abandoned, delayed, or abandoned and then restarted, or if the authorized contracting parties deviate from plans, blueprints, designs, specifications or timetables, the project will still be deemed to be the same construction project.

#### VI. Section II - Who Is An Insured

#### A. Newly Acquired Or Formed Organization

Paragraph **3. a.** is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:

**a.** Coverage under this provision is afforded only until the 180<sup>th</sup> day after you acquire or form the organization or the end of the policy period, whichever is earlier;

However, this provision does not apply if the newly formed or acquired organization is excluded by either a provision of the Coverage Part or by endorsement.

#### **B.** Controlling Interest

The following is added under **Section II – Who Is An Insured:** 

Any organization over which you maintain ownership of more than 50% will be a Named Insured if there is no other similar insurance available to that organization; however

- (1) Coverage A does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization; and
- (2) Coverage B does not apply to "personal and advertising injury" arising out of an offense committed before you acquired or formed the organization.

If such organizations are not shown in the Declarations, you must report them to us within 180 days of inception date of the policy.

#### C. Additional Insureds

1. The following additional insureds are added to Section II – Who Is An Insured:

#### a. Owners, Managers, Contractors And Lessors Of Equipment

Who Is An Insured is amended to include as an additional insured any person or organization, other than a controlling interest or vendors, you are required by written agreement or written contract or permit to include as an additional insured, but only with respect to liability for "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" caused, in whole or in part, by:

- (1) Your acts or omissions in the performance of your ongoing operations for the additional insured; or
- (2) The acts or omissions of those acting on your behalf in the performance of your ongoing operations for the additional insured; or
- (3) Maintenance or use of equipment leased or rented from such additional insured(s); or
- (4) Maintenance or use of that part of any premises leased or rented to you; or
- (5) Maintenance or use of that part of any premises owned by you; or

(6) Maintenance or use of any premises owned by you but leased or rented to others.

#### b. Vendors

Who Is An Insured is amended to include as an additional insured any person or organization (referred to below as vendor) with whom you agreed under a written contract or written agreement to provide insurance, but only with respect to "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of "your products" which are distributed or sold in the regular course of the vendor's business.

- (1) However:
  - (a) The insurance afforded to such vendor only applies to the extent permitted by law; and
  - (b) If coverage provided to the vendor is required by a contract or agreement, the insurance afforded to such vendor will not be broader than that which you are required by the contract or agreement to provide to such vendor.
- (2) With respect to the insurance afforded to these vendors, the following additional exclusions apply:

The insurance afforded the vendor does not apply to:

- (a) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which the vendor is obligated to pay damages by reason of the assumption of liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages that the vendor would have in the absence of the contract or agreement;
- (b) Any express warranty unauthorized by you;
- (c) Any physical or chemical change in the product made intentionally by the vendor;
- (d) Repackaging, except when unpacked solely for the purpose of inspection, demonstration, testing or the substitution of parts under instruction from the manufacturer, and then repackaged in the original container;
- (e) Any failure to make such inspection, adjustments, tests or servicing as the vendor has agreed to make or normally undertakes to make in the usual course of business in connection with the distribution of the products;
- (f) Demonstration, installation, servicing or repair operations, except such operations performed at the vendor's premises in connection with the sale of the product; or
- (g) Products which, after distribution or sale by you, have been labeled or relabeled or used as a container, part or ingredient of any other thing or substance by or for the vendor; or
- (h) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the sole negligence of the vendor for its own acts or omissions or those of its employees or anyone else acting on its behalf. However, this exclusion does not apply to:
  - (i) The exceptions contained in subparagraphs C.1.b.(2)(d) or C.1.b.(2)(f) of this Coverage Extension; or
  - (ii) Such inspections, adjustments, tests or servicing as the vendor has agreed to make or normally undertakes to make in the usual course of business, in connection with the distribution or sale of the products.
- (i) Any person or organization from whom you have acquired any products, including any ingredient, part or container entering into, accompanying or containing "your products".
- **c.** Any person or organization granting a license to make, or distribute "your products" including "your products" which use the name or logo of grantor and to whom you are obligated by virtue of the written contract to provide insurance such as afforded by this policy, but only with respect to liability arising out of "your products".
- 2. The following Exclusions are applicable to all Additional Insureds:
  - **a.** This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" arising out of the rendering of or the failure to render any professional services by you or on your behalf but only with respect to any of the following operations:
    - (1) The preparing, providing, approving, or failing to prepare, provide or approve, maps, shop

drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings and specifications; or

- (2) Providing, or hiring independent professionals to provide, engineering, architectural or surveying services in connection with construction work you perform.
- (3) Supervisory, inspection, architectural or engineering activities.

Professional services do not include services within construction means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures employed by you in connection with your operations in your capacity as a construction contractor.

- **b.** This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" not caused, in whole or in part, by you or by those acting on your behalf.
- c. This endorsement does not apply to any rail-road named as an additional insured whether by agreement, contract or permit.
- **d.** This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury or "property damage" occurring after leased or rented equipment is returned to the lessor.
- e. This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurring after:
  - (1) All work, including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work, on the project (other than service, maintenance or repairs) to be performed by or on behalf of the additional insured(s) has been completed; or
  - (2) That portion of "your work" out of which the injury or damage arises has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor engaged in performing operations for a principal as a part of the same project.
- **f.** This insurance does not apply to any "occurrence" which takes place after you cease to be a tenant in any premises for which any-one has been included as an additional insured.
- **g.** This insurance does not apply to structural alterations, new construction or demolition operations performed by or on behalf of the additional insured at any premises in which you are a tenant, unless you are performing such operations and are required by written contract or agreement to include the premises' owner or manager as an additional insured.
- **h.** This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the "products completed operations hazard".

This exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of "your products" which are distributed or sold in the regular course of the vendor's business, as provided under Subparagraph **b. Vendors** of Paragraph **VI.C. Additional Insureds.** 

i. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" occurring before the signing of the contract or agreement, or the issuance of the permit, requiring the person or organization to be added as an additional insured.

VII. The following are added to Section III – Limits Of Insurance:

#### A. Product Recall Expense

\$100,000 is the most we will pay for all "product recall expenses" arising out of the same defect or deficiency.

#### **B** Professional Services

Subject to the Limited Professional Liability provisions of this endorsement in Section I – Coverage - Coverage A – Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability – 2. Exclusions and Coverage B – Personal And Advertising Injury Liability – 2. Exclusions the most we will pay for Professional Services is \$50,000 each annual period.

#### VIII. Section IV- Commercial General Liability Conditions

#### A. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Offense, Claim Or Suit

1. Paragraph 2.a. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Offense, Claim Or Suit is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:

**a**. You must see to it that we are notified as soon as practicable of an "occurrence" or an offense which may result in a claim.

Knowledge of an "occurrence" or an offense by your "employees" shall not, in itself, constitute knowledge to you unless you, your partners, "executive officers", directors, insurance manager or risk manager shall have actually received notice. To the extent possible, notice should include:

- (1) How, when and where the "occurrence" or offense took place;
- (2) The names and addresses of any injured persons and witnesses; and
- (3) The nature and location of any injury or damage arising out of the "occurrence" or offense.
- 2. The following are added to Paragraph 2. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Offense, Claim Or Suit:
  - **a.** Your rights afforded under this policy shall not be prejudiced if you fail to give us notice of an "occurrence", offense, claim or "suit", solely due to your reasonable and documented belief that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" is not covered under this policy.
  - **b.** You must see to it that the following are done in the event of an actual or anticipated "covered recall" that may result in "product recall expense":
    - (1) Give us prompt notice of any discovery or notification that "your product" must be withdrawn or recalled. Include a description of "your product" and the reason for withdrawal or recall.
    - (2) Cease any further release, shipment, consignment or any other method or distribution of like or similar products until it has been determined that all such products are free from defects that could be a cause of loss under this insurance.

#### **B.** Representations

The following is added to paragraph 6. Representations:

If you should unintentionally fail to disclose all existing hazards at the inception date of this policy, we will not deny coverage under this policy solely because of such failure.

This provision does not affect our right to collect additional premium or to exercise our right of cancellation or non-renewal.

#### C. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us (Waiver of Subrogation)

The following is added to this clause:

If a written agreement, written contract or permit requires that you waive any right of recovery against any person or organization we also waive any right of recovery we may have against that person or organization because of payments we make for injury or damage arising out of "your work" for that person or organization.

#### D. The following are added to Section IV – Commercial General Liability Conditions:

#### 1. Primary Insurance – Non Contributing

When required in writing by an agreement, contract or permit with any additional insured, the insurance afforded to such additional insured is primary. Other insurance listing such additional insured as a named insured in the declarations will apply as excess and not contribute as primary to the insurance afforded by this endorsement.

- 2. Any agreement, contract, lease or permit requiring:
  - a. You to include any person or organization as an additional insured; or
  - **b.** You to waive your rights of recovery against any person or organization; or
  - c. That this insurance be primary;

must be signed prior to an "occurrence" or offense.

#### E. Liberalization

If we revise this Coverage Part to provide more coverage without additional premium charge, your policy will automatically provide the additional coverage as of the day the revision is effective in your

state.

#### VII. Section V – Definitions

- **A.** The following Definitions are revised:
  - 1. Paragraph 9. a. "Insured contract" is deleted in its entirety and replaced by:
    - a. A contract for a lease of premises. However, that portion of the contract for a lease of premises that indemnifies any person or organization for damage by fire, lightning, explosion or "sprinkler leakage" to premises while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner is not an "insured contract";
  - 2. Paragraph 3. is deleted and replaced as follows:

"Bodily injury" means injury, sickness or disease sustained by a person. This includes mental anguish, mental injury, shock, fright or death resulting from "bodily injury", sickness or disease.

**B.** The following definitions are added:

"Location" means premises involving the same or connecting lots, or premises whose connection is interrupted only by a street, roadway, waterway or right-of-way of a rail-road.

"Sprinkler Leakage" means the accidental leakage or discharge of any fire extinguishing or fire suppression substance from an automatic sprinkler system or other automatic fire extinguishing system or automatic fire suppression system. It does not include the discharge of any automatic sprinkler or automatic fire extinguishing system or fire suppression system that discharges in response to a fire.

"Covered recall" means:

- (1) A product recall made necessary because you determine that the product recall is necessary; or
- (2) An authorized government entity has ordered you to conduct a product recall.

"Product recall expense" means necessary and reasonable expenses for:

- (1) Costs of notification;
- (2) Costs of stationery, envelopes, production of announcements and postage or facsimiles;
- (3) Costs of overtime paid to your regular non-salaried employees and costs incurred by your employees, including costs of transportation and accommodations;
- (4) Costs of computer time;
- (5) Costs of hiring independent contractors and other temporary employees;
- (6) Costs of transportation, shipping or packaging
- (7) Costs of warehouse or storage space; or
- (8) Costs of proper disposal of "your products", or products that contain "your products", that can not be reused, not exceeding your purchase price or your cost to produce the products.

"Professional services" means:

- (1) The preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve, maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders, or drawings and specifications; and
- (2) Supervisory or inspection activities performed as part of any related architectural or engineering activities.

All other policy wording not specifically changed, modified, or replaced by this endorsement remains in effect.

# THIS ENDORSEMENT CHANGES THE POLICY. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY. **EXCLUSION - PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES**

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

#### COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE FORM

It is agreed that this policy excludes any claim for "punitive or exemplary damages" whether arising out of the acts of the insured, insured's "employees" or any other person. The company shall not have an obligation to pay for any costs, interest, or damages attributable to "punitive or exemplary damages".

#### Definition:

"Punitive or Exemplary Damages" means damages, other than compensatory and nominal damages, awarded against a person to punish and to discourage him and others from similar conduct in the future and shall include exemplary damages.

# **COMMON POLICY CONDITIONS**

All Coverage Parts included in this policy are subject to the following conditions.

#### A. Cancellation

- 1. The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations may cancel this policy by mailing or delivering to us advance written notice of cancellation.
- 2. We may cancel this policy by mailing or delivering to the first Named Insured written notice of cancellation at least:
  - a. 10 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for nonpayment of premium; or
  - **b.** 30 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for any other reason.
- We will mail or deliver our notice to the first Named Insured's last mailing address known to us.
- **4.** Notice of cancellation will state the effective date of cancellation. The policy period will end on that date.
- 5. If this policy is cancelled, we will send the first Named Insured any premium refund due. If we cancel, the refund will be pro rata. If the first Named Insured cancels, the refund may be less than pro rata. The cancellation will be effective even if we have not made or offered a refund.
- 6. If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

#### B. Changes

This policy contains all the agreements between you and us concerning the insurance afforded. The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations is authorized to make changes in the terms of this policy with our consent. This policy's terms can be amended or waived only by endorsement issued by us and made a part of this policy.

#### C. Examination Of Your Books And Records

We may examine and audit your books and records as they relate to this policy at any time during the policy period and up to three years afterward.

#### **D. Inspections And Surveys**

- 1. We have the right to:
  - a. Make inspections and surveys at any time;

- **b.** Give you reports on the conditions we find; and
- c. Recommend changes.
- 2. We are not obligated to make any inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations and any such actions we do undertake relate only to insurability and the premiums to be charged. We do not make safety inspections. We do not undertake to perform the duty of any person or organization to provide for the health or safety of workers or the public. And we do not warrant that conditions:
  - a. Are safe or healthful; or
  - **b.** Comply with laws, regulations, codes or standards.
- 3. Paragraphs 1. and 2. of this condition apply not only to us, but also to any rating, advisory, rate service or similar organization which makes insurance inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations.
- Paragraph 2. of this condition does not apply to any inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations we may make relative to certification, under state or municipal statutes, ordinances or regulations, of boilers, pressure vessels or elevators.

#### E. Premiums

The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations:

- 1. Is responsible for the payment of all premiums; and
- 2. Will be the payee for any return premiums we pay.

#### F. Transfer Of Your Rights And Duties Under This Policy

Your rights and duties under this policy may not be transferred without our written consent except in the case of death of an individual named insured.

If you die, your rights and duties will be transferred to your legal representative but only while acting within the scope of duties as your legal representative. Until your legal representative is appointed, anyone having proper temporary custody of your property will have your rights and duties but only with respect to that property.

### NUCLEAR ENERGY LIABILITY EXCLUSION ENDORSEMENT

(Broad Form)

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE COVERAGE PART COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY COVERAGE PART FARM COVERAGE PART LIQUOR LIABILITY COVERAGE PART MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY COVERAGE PART OWNERS AND CONTRACTORS PROTECTIVE LIABILITY COVERAGE PART POLLUTION LIABILITY COVERAGE PART PRODUCTS/COMPLETED OPERATIONS LIABILITY COVERAGE PART RAILROAD PROTECTIVE LIABILITY COVERAGE PART UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK POLICY

- 1. The insurance does not apply:
  - A. Under any Liability Coverage, to "bodily injury" or "property damage":
    - (1) With respect to which an "insured" under the policy is also an insured under a nuclear energy liability policy issued by Nuclear Energy Liability Insurance Association, Mutual Atomic Energy Liability Underwriters, Nuclear Insurance Association of Canada or any of their successors, or would be an insured under any such policy but for its termination upon exhaustion of its limit of liability; or
    - (2) Resulting from the "hazardous properties" of "nuclear material" and with respect to which (a) any person or organization is required to maintain financial protection pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, or any law amendatory thereof, or (b) the "insured" is, or had this policy not been issued would be, entitled to indemnity from the United States of America, or any agency thereof, under any agreement entered into by the United States of America, or any agency thereof, with any person or organization.
  - **B.** Under any Medical Payments coverage, to expenses incurred with respect to "bodily injury" resulting from the "hazardous properties" of "nuclear material" and arising out of the operation of a "nuclear facility" by any person or organization.

- **C.** Under any Liability Coverage, to "bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from "hazardous properties" of "nuclear material", if:
  - (1) The "nuclear material" (a) is at any "nuclear facility" owned by, or operated by or on behalf of, an "insured" or (b) has been discharged or dispersed therefrom;
  - (2) The "nuclear material" is contained in "spent fuel" or "waste" at any time possessed, handled, used, processed, stored, transported or disposed of, by or on behalf of an "insured"; or
  - (3) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" arises out of the furnishing by an "insured" of services, materials, parts or equipment in connection with the planning, construction, maintenance, operation or use of any "nuclear facility", but if such facility is located within the United States of America, its territories or possessions or Canada, this exclusion (3) applies only to "property damage" to such "nuclear facility" and any property thereat.
- **2.** As used in this endorsement:

"Hazardous properties" includes radioactive, toxic or explosive properties.

"Nuclear material" means "source material", "special nuclear material" or "by-product material".

"Source material", "special nuclear material", and "by-product material" have the meanings given them in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 or in any law amendatory thereof.

"Spent fuel" means any fuel element or fuel component, solid or liquid, which has been used or exposed to radiation in a "nuclear reactor".

"Waste" means any waste material (a) containing "by-product material" other than the tailings or wastes produced by the extraction or concentration of uranium or thorium from any ore processed primarily for its "source material" content, and (b) resulting from the operation by any person or organization of any "nuclear facility" included under the first two paragraphs of the definition of "nuclear facility".

"Nuclear facility" means:

- (a) Any "nuclear reactor";
- (b) Any equipment or device designed or used for (1) separating the isotopes of uranium or plutonium, (2) processing or utilizing "spent fuel", or (3) handling, processing or packaging "waste";

- (c) Any equipment or device used for the processing, fabricating or alloying of "special nuclear material" if at any time the total amount of such material in the custody of the "insured" at the premises where such equipment or device is located consists of or contains more than 25 grams of plutonium or uranium 233 or any combination thereof, or more than 250 grams of uranium 235;
- (d) Any structure, basin, excavation, premises or place prepared or used for the storage or disposal of "waste";

and includes the site on which any of the foregoing is located, all operations conducted on such site and all premises used for such operations.

"Nuclear reactor" means any apparatus designed or used to sustain nuclear fission in a selfsupporting chain reaction or to contain a critical mass of fissionable material.

"Property damage" includes all forms of radioactive contamination of property.

## **COLORADO CHANGES – CIVIL UNION**

- A. The term "spouse" is replaced by the following: Spouse or party to a civil union recognized under Colorado law.
- **B.** Under the Commercial Automobile Coverage Part, the term "family member" is replaced by the following and supersedes any other provisions to the contrary:

"Family member" means a person related to you by blood, adoption, marriage or civil union recognized under Colorado law, who is a resident of your household, including a ward or foster child.

- A. Paragraph 2. of the **Cancellation** Common Policy Condition is replaced by the following:
  - If this policy has been in effect for less than 60 days, we may cancel this policy by mailing or delivering to the first Named Insured written notice of cancellation at least:
    - a. 10 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for nonpayment of premium; or
    - **b.** 30 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for any other reason.
- **B.** The following is added to the **Cancellation** Common Policy Condition:
  - 7. Cancellation Of Policies In Effect For 60 Days Or More
    - **a.** If this policy has been in effect for 60 days or more, or is a renewal of a policy we issued, we may cancel this policy by mailing through first-class mail to the first Named Insured written notice of cancellation:
      - Including the actual reason, at least 10 days before the effective date of cancellation, if we cancel for nonpayment of premium; or
      - (2) At least 45 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for any other reason.

We may only cancel this policy based on one or more of the following reasons:

- (1) Nonpayment of premium;
- (2) A false statement knowingly made by the insured on the application for insurance; or
- (3) A substantial change in the exposure or risk other than that indicated in the application and underwritten as of the effective date of the policy unless the first Named Insured has notified us of the change and we accept such change.
- **C.** The following is added and supersedes any other provision to the contrary:

#### NONRENEWAL

If we decide not to renew this policy, we will mail through first-class mail to the first Named Insured shown in the Declarations written notice of the nonrenewal at least 45 days before the expiration date, or its anniversary date if it is a policy written for a term of more than one year or with no fixed expiration date.

If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

**D.** The following condition is added:

# INCREASE IN PREMIUM OR DECREASE IN COVERAGE

We will not increase the premium unilaterally or decrease the coverage benefits on renewal of this policy unless we mail through first-class mail written notice of our intention, including the actual reason, to the first Named Insured's last mailing address known to us, at least 45 days before the effective date. Any decrease in coverage during the policy term must be based on one or more of the following reasons:

- 1. Nonpayment of premium;
- **2.** A false statement knowingly made by the insured on the application for insurance; or
- **3.** A substantial change in the exposure or risk other than that indicated in the application and underwritten as of the effective date of the policy unless the first Named Insured has notified us of the change and we accept such change.

If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

#### THIS ENDORSEMENT IS ATTACHED TO AND MADE PART OF YOUR POLICY IN RESPONSE TO THE DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TERRORISM RISK INSURANCE ACT. THIS ENDORSEMENT DOES NOT GRANT ANY COVERAGE OR CHANGE THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ANY COVERAGE UNDER THE POLICY.

#### A. Disclosure Of Premium

In accordance with the federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, we are required to provide you with a notice disclosing the portion of your premium, if any, attributable to coverage for terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act. The portion of your premium attributable to such coverage is shown in the Schedule of this endorsement or in the policy Declarations.

#### B. Disclosure Of Federal Participation In Payment Of Terrorism Losses

The United States Government, Department of the Treasury, will pay a share of terrorism losses insured under the federal program. The federal share equals a percentage (as shown in Part II of the Schedule of this endorsement or in the policy Declarations) of that portion of the amount of such insured losses that exceeds the applicable insurer retention. However, if aggregate insured losses attributable to terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act exceed \$100 billion in a calendar year, the Treasury shall not make any payment for any portion of the amount of such losses that exceeds \$100 billion.

#### C. Cap On Insurer Participation In Payment Of Terrorism Losses

If aggregate insured losses attributable to terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act exceed \$100 billion in a calendar year and we have met our insurer deductible under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, we shall not be liable for the payment of any portion of the amount of such losses that exceeds \$100 billion, and in such case insured losses up to that amount are subject to pro rata allocation in accordance with procedures established by the Secretary of the Treasury.

### **EXCLUSION - ASBESTOS**

The Exclusion Section of the Liability Coverage provided under this policy is amended to add the following:

#### Asbestos

- A. This insurance does not apply to any loss of, "bodily injury," "property damage," or "personal and advertising injury"" arising out of the actual, alleged or suspected:
  - 1. Ingestion, inhalation, absorption, presence or exposure or threat of exposure to asbestos in any form, or goods, products containing any form of asbestos;
  - 2. Use of any form of asbestos in constructing or manufacturing any good, product or structure;
  - 3. Removal of any form of asbestos from any good, product or structure; or
  - 4. The manufacture, intellectual development, sale, transportation, storage, or disposal of asbestos or goods or products containing any form of asbestos.
- B. We will not pay:
  - 1. Loss, cost or expense, including but not limited to defense costs, claim expenses, bonds or fees arising out of any request, demand, or order that any insured or others identify, abate, test for, sample, monitor, clean up, remove, cover, contain, treat, detoxify, decontaminate, neutralize, or mitigate; or in any way respond to or assess the effects of asbestos; or repair, replace or improve any property as a result of such effects; or
  - 2. Loss, cost or expense arising out of any claim or "suit" by or on behalf of a government authority for damages because of identification of, abatement of, testing for, sampling, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, covering, containing, treating, detoxifying, decontaminating, neutralizing, or mitigating; or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of asbestos; or repairing, replacing or improving any property as a result of such effects.
- C. This exclusion applies whether or not:
  - 1. Such loss, cost or expense was caused by the instigation of, or with the direct or indirect involvement of any Named Insured, the Named Insured's employees, Additional Insureds or other persons on the Named Insured's premises or worksite at any time.
  - 2. Such loss, cost or expense was caused by or arising out of the failure at any time of any Named Insured, the Named Insured's employees, Additional Insureds, or other persons on any Named Insured's premises or worksite to supervise or keep the premise or worksite in a safe condition.

### EXCLUSION – LEAD

The Exclusion Section of the Liability Coverage provided under this policy is amended to add the following:

#### Lead

- A. Any injury or damage arising out of the actual, alleged, threatened, or suspected:
  - 1. Ingestion, inhalation, absorption, presence, or threat of exposure to lead in any form, or goods or, products containing lead in any form;
  - 2. Use of lead in any form in constructing or manufacturing any good, product or structure;
  - 3. Removal of lead in any form from any good, product or structure;
  - 4. Discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of lead in any form; or
  - 5. Manufacture, intellectual development, sale, transportation, storage or disposal of lead in any form, or goods or products containing lead in any form.
- B. Any loss, cost or expense arising out of any:
  - 1. Request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any insured or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, lead in any form;
  - 2. Claim or suit by or on behalf of a government authority for damages because of identification of, abatement of, testing for, sampling, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, covering, containing, treating, detoxifying, decontaminating, neutralizing, or mitigating, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of lead in any form, or the repair, replacement or improvement of any property as a result of such effects;
- C. Paragraph B. applies whether or not such loss, cost or expense:
  - 1. Was caused by the instigation of, or with the direct or indirect involvement of, any Named Insured, the Named Insured's employees, additional insureds or other persons on the insured's premises or worksite at any time; or
  - 2. Arises out of the failure at any time of any Named Insured, the Named Insured's employees, additional insureds or other persons on any Named Insured's premises or worksite to supervise or keep the premise or worksite in a safe condition.
- D. Fines or penalties imposed by a governmental authority because of or in connection with any activity, event, condition or circumstance contained or described in A., B., or C. above.
